## Introduction to Taiwan

Taiwan, also known as Formosa, is an island in East Asia, situated off the southeastern coast of mainland China and in the western Pacific Ocean. Despite its small size, it features a diverse landscape of mountains, forests, vibrant cities, and scenic coastlines. With a population of 23.26 million and its capital in Taipei, Taiwan is renowned for its robust economy, advanced technology sector, and democratic values. As a global leader in semiconductor and electronics innovation, it combines modern progress with rich culture, warm hospitality, lively night markets, and natural beauty, making it one of Asia's most dynamic and progressive nations.

#### **Geography**

Taiwan is an island situated between Japan's Ryukyu Islands to the north and the Philippines to the south, separated from mainland China by the Taiwan Strait to the west. Covering an area of about 36,000 km², roughly twice the size of Kruger National Park, around 70% of Taiwan consists of rugged mountains and hills, while most of its plains lie along the western coast.

#### i Climate

Taiwan has a humid subtropical to tropical climate, shaped by seasonal monsoons. The island experiences mild winters and long, warm summers, with an annual average temperature ranging from 14°C to 30°C and average rainfall of around 2,500 mm. Northern and eastern Taiwan receive rainfall throughout the year, while the southern regions experience distinct wet and dry seasons. By March, Taiwan transitions from winter to spring, ushering in comfortable weather and a blooming landscape. Temperatures typically range from 18°C to 26°C, with occasional light rain and increasing sunshine, making it ideal for outdoor activities and travel.

### ii Demographics

The island is inhabited by two primary races, the Taiwanese Aborigines and the Han Chinese. Over 70% of the population dwells in the five major urban centres on the West Coast. Among these, the largest metropolis, Taipei, is where the capital city is situated and one of the major metropolises in Asia.

#### iii Culture

The social fabric of Taiwanese society is composed of Fukien culture, represented by Hokkien, Hakka culture, represented by Hakka, New Culture, represented by Mainlanders, as well as South Island culture, represented by the aborigines. Furthermore, the 50 years of Japanese Occupation also resulted in the appropriation of Japanese, European, and American culture in Taiwanese Culture. The popular use of the folk calendar dictates daily life, recording the perfect dates for housewarmings, grand openings, weddings, and funerals. The Chinese horoscope in the folk calendar also acts as a guideline for arranged marriages and wedding arrangements. The aborigine tribes hold numerous indigenous religious rituals, such as Bunun chorus, Saixia sacrificial rites, and Dawu Flying Fish rites.

(Flight must arrive before 12:00)

**Return:** 21<sup>st</sup> March: From Kaohsiung International Airport to South Africa (SA)

(Flight should depart after 19:50)

#### **Group Schedule:**

8<sup>th</sup> March 12:00 → Group meet and greet at Taoyuan International Airport (Terminal 1)

21<sup>st</sup> March 17:00 → Tour ends Kaohsiung International Airport.

- Transport from Pier-2 Art Centre to Kaohsiung International Airport will depart at 17:00, with an estimated travel time of approximately 30 min -1hour.
- Please ensure your return flight departs after 19:50 to allow sufficient time for airport check-in and security.
- Participants their own travel will proceed independently after the tour concludes at Kaohsiung International Airport.

#### About VISA

We will apply for the visa together on 6<sup>th</sup> February 2026. More information will be shared in the WhatsApp group closer to the date.

- > An invitation letter will be provided by the temple for this tour.
- For South African passport holders, there will be no visa fees for a holiday single entry visa. (Fast track application R400.00)
- ➤ For other African countries, eg. Tanzania, the VISA fees is R800.00 (Fast track application R1200.00)
- ➤ Visa application takes 7 10 working days.

### Document required for a holiday visa application as per Taipei Liaison office:

- 1. Complete Application Form (online)
- 2. 2 x Passport size colour photos
- 3. Letter of invitation
- 4. Plane ticket
- 5. Proof of Accommodation (pending confirmation)
- 6. Proof of Employment (pending confirmation)
- 7. 3 months bank statement (pending confirmation)

Final list of required documents to be confirmed on the WhatsApp group as the Taipei Liaison Office has been contacted and informed of this tour.

## Tour includes

Accommodation, Entrance fee, all breakfast, approximately 6 lunches, 3 dinners, Boat trips, Train Rides, and Travel insurance.

## **NOT included**

Flight, Visa, Partial meals, and own expenses.

## Special accommodation conditions

- 1. Most accommodation will be arranged at hotels, with a few nights at Fo Guang Shan temple/monasteries. During the temple stay, all participants are expected to obey the temple/monastery rules.
- 2. Lodging conditions will vary at each hotel and the temple/monastery. Room assignments will be made at each location. Please note that single or double rooms may not always be available. There might also be group rooms (3-4 people per room) as well as rooms separated by gender (couples will be separated).
