Description: Solution Focused Therapy has been described as the model that heralds “the death of resistance” among clients. SFT will be unpacked in this introductory workshop. Participants will learn how nothing always happens, nothing always works and how this can work as a tool for change. Assessing clients as visitors, complaints, or customers, along with goal setting, and how to properly address goals that dampens resistance will be addressed along with what is the role of the therapist/provider, if not that of a problem solver? Power Points, demonstration interviews, videos, and brief practice periods will be utilized.
