What to Expect: Support Groups

This section offers a detailed list of in-person support groups for people with traumatic brain injury (TBI), as well as their caregivers and family members. These groups provide a safe, welcoming space where people can connect, share their experiences, ask questions, and find emotional support from others who understand what they're going through.

- Format: Information is organized in chart form, sorted by location within each region (1-9)
- Includes: Group names, physical meeting locations, times, contact phone numbers, and facilitator details
- Note: In addition to listings from the selected region, support group options from surrounding counties are included to increase accessibility, especially for rural or underserved areas





What to Expect: Transportation Services

This section highlights transportation options that help people with TBI get to medical appointments, rehab centers, community programs, and other important services. It includes low-cost, Medicaid-funded, and community-sponsored services to make sure travel is easy and affordable for everyone.

- Format: A detailed chart format including the transportation provider name, service area, phone number, services offered, and how to utilize the services
- Includes: Non-emergency medical transport, public or regional transit systems, and community mobility programs specifically serving individuals with disabilities
- Note: Transportation options from nearby counties are included when they serve overlapping service areas or offer broader route coverage





What to Expect: Assistive Technology

This section shares helpful resources for assistive technology that support people with TBI in gaining more independence, improving communication, moving around, and handling daily tasks. The tools and services include things like mobility aids, communication devices, and adaptive equipment for use at home or at work.

- Format: A structured chart that lists the name of each organization or provider, county served, physical address, phone number, and services offered
- Includes: Assistive device demonstration sites, lending libraries, evaluation centers, and providers of adaptive home and vehicle modifications
- Note: If certain assistive technology services are not available in the user's region, resources from nearby counties are included to ensure access

This section provides helpful information about local services that support TBI patients and their families as they adjust and reconnect with their communities. These services are here to make life a little easier and offer support in many ways. - Note: Counties adjacent to the region are included to offer a wider range of services when availability in the user's home county is limited




What to Expect: Substance Abuse Disorder Resources
